1. **Augustine STORY**. He lived in Norwich, England, and is presumed to be a relative of Elias Story, whose grave is in Plymouth, MA. Elias was a passenger on the Mayflower.

# SECOND GENERATION

2. **William STORY Sr**<sup>1,2,3</sup> (Augustine-1) was born about 1613 in Norwich, England.<sup>4,1</sup> He immigrated on April 8, 1637.<sup>2</sup> He died in 1702.<sup>4</sup> He came to America as a servant of Samuel Dix on the "John and Dorothy," embarking April 8, 1637, and landing in Ipswich, Massachusetts. He was a farmer, a surveyor of highways, and a miller.

He was a carpenter; 8 May 1649 purchased a farm of 90 acres from Henry Archer and his wife Elizabeth, granted to them by the town of Ipswich beyond Chebacco Falls; again on 10 November 1652 obtained lands in Chebacco, adjoining on the northwest land of John Webster; and finally in 1664 he had a share and a half in Plumb Island; voted in the town in 1679; he was a surveyor of highways in 1662; in 1671 had permission to have a saw mill on the Chebacco River. The cellar hole and doorstone are still there.

He signed to Loyalist Petition in 1668 and also the Proctor Petition.

His sons Seth and William received their father's property in 1683.

Andrews and Story in Witchcraft:

John Proctor, who was born in Chebacco, had moved to Salem. He and his wife Elizabeth, had the awful misfortune to be charged of being witches. They were arrested, cast into prison, tried and convicted. Most persistent efforts in their behalf for clemency were made. While in prison Proctor addressed Rev. Cotton Mather and others imploring their assistance that their innocent blood might be spared. Their neighbors joined in a petition to the courts to save them. Rev. John Wise drew up a petition which was signed by the men of old Chebacco, whose names were: John Wise, William Cogswell, [William Story Sr.], Jonathan Cogswell, [Reginald Foster], John Cogswell Jr., Thomas Choate, John Cogswell Sr., John Burnham Sr., Thomas Andrews, William Thompson, Joseph Andrews, Thomas Low Sr., Benjamin Marshall, Isaac Foster, John Andrews Jr., John Burnham Jr., William Ruslin, William Goodhue, William Andrews, Isaac Perkins, John Andrews, Nathaniel Perkins, John Choate, Sr., Thomas Wilkens, Joseph Proctor, William Cogswell, Samuel Giddings, Thomas Varney, Joseph Eveleth, John Fellows, James White.

This document and list of names of those courageous humane and tolerant men, compare favorably with any which has come down to me from the early colonial period of the country. By their act they opposed the intolerance and superstition of the Puritans of New England, promulgated, represented and controlled by its clergy and magistrates, a class of rulers whose opposition or enmity it was dangerous to encounter. Their acts on that occasion were at the hazard of their own lives [???] as slight causes while attempting to interfere with public affairs. It required stout hearts for our ancestors to sign and present that petition at that particular time, more perilous in some respects than the case of their resistance to the unlawful tax. Human blood was then rated cheap as the penalty for resisting the authority and power controlled and executed by tyrannical rulers. But our grand old ancestor and his neighbors were again fighting a righteous cause, for humanity and against ignorance and superstition, and while their efforts were futile to save the lives of both victims, for John Proctor was hanged, but his wife was spared. The wave of fanaticism retreated and that reign of terror passed away - we hope - forever.

#### HISTORICAL NOTE:

Indentured Servant, a person who worked without wages, usually for a period of five to seven years, in exchange for payment of the person's passage to the American colonies. The contract, called an "indenture," entitled the servant to food, clothing, shelter, and medical attention. Devised by the Virginia Company in the late 1610s, the system provided cheap labor. It is estimated that one-half to two-thirds of all European immigrants to the colonies participated in the system, some voluntarily, some as victims of penal servitude. The practice disappeared after 1800. [GAHFF]

Salem Witchcraft Trials (May-October 1692), trials that resulted from witchcraft hysteria in Salem Village, Massachusetts Bay Colony. When a group of teenaged girls began to behave oddly, officials concluded that they were bewitched. Under pressure, they identified local residents as witches and wizards, resulting in dozens of arrests. Of the twenty-seven people who went to trial, nineteen were hanged and one man was pressed to death. Ironically, only those who maintained their innocence were executed; those who confessed escaped the hangman's noose. Realizing this fact, some confessed in order to save themselves. The community was torn apart by accusations and fear. Boston clergyman Cotton Mather supported the persecutions, but his brother Increase Mather argued against the convictions and attempted to play a moderating role during the crisis. Governor William Phips forbade further trials, and a new court acquitted or discharged the remaining prisoners. [GAHFF]

He lyes ye body of Mrs. Elizabeth Story wife of Dea. Seth Story who died March 12, 1736 age about 87 years 1736

He was a sergeant in King Phillip's Indian War 1675 - 1677. Seth Story and William Andrews were with Capt. Church (1675) in MA and Plymouth. More than half the towns were wholly or partly destroyed, more than one tenth of the men of military age were slain or made prisoners by the Indians. The little colonies were long recovering from there losses.

He made his will June 24, 1724 in which he mentions his dearly beloved wife and sons Jechariah, Seth- daughter Sarah Jewett 20 shillings, Elizabeth Andrews 20 shillings, Martha Butler 5 pounds, Damaris Martin 20 shillings and a bed.

A portion of his house, which was built in Essex in 1684, Massachusetts, is preserved in the Winterthur museum in Winterthur, Delaware.

#### HISTORICAL NOTE:

King Philip's War (1675-76), an attempt to oust white settlers from New England. Metacomet (known to the whites as King Philip), son of Massasoit, led the uprising, which included forces from the Wampanoag, Narragansett, Nipmuck, and Pocumtuck tribes. Determined to drive all white settlers from New England, the bands destroyed twelve of ninety Puritan towns and attacked forty others. About a thousand Indians were killed, in turn, in the Great Swamp Massacre. The war ended shortly after Metacomet's capture and murder in August 1676. Many of his supporters escaped to Canada while others were sold into slavery in the West Indies. [GAHFF]

Job Story, one of the pioneers of Bedford Township, was born in Essex, Massachusetts August 6, 1791, and died at his home in Bedford Township, Meigs Co., Ohio March 19, 1883, being 91 years, 7 months, and 13 days old.

He was the third child of a family of twelve. His father, John Story, was a fisherman, but when Job was 16 years old, he moved to Enfield, Grafton Co., New Hampshire, where he followed farming.

When Job was 23 years old (1814) he, in company with his brother, George, started to walk to Ohio. Each carried a pack on his back weighing about 30 pounds. They came via Troy, New York and Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, walking the entire distance, 598 miles (except 5 miles) to the latter place, where they took passage on an open boat called the Blacksnake for Marietta. After traveling about 130 miles in this way they became dissatisfied with the mode of traveling and again pursued their journey on foot. They arrived at their brother John's in Orange Township May 1, 1816 having been 30 days on the way, traveling 600 miles, an average of 24 miles per day. Their journey cost them \$39.19, an average of \$1.30 per day.

Job remained in this county nearly two year, working for most of the time for \$12.00 per month, or 62.5 cents or one bushel of wheat per day, in harvest. He spent the days and nights in Bedford Township when there was but one house in it.

After selecting a piece of land, he returned as he came, to his home in New Hampshire and it was not until the year 1833 that he finally moved to Miegs County with his wife and six children in the company of two other families, 19 persons in all. They cam in wagons without locks and made the trip in 30 days. He purchased 120 acres of land near Burlingham for \$200.00 and lived upon the same until the time of his death. There were at that time about 50 voters in Bedford.

He was at one time clerk of the township but failed to be reelected because he charged \$3.00 for his services. He was one of the school examiners for a number of years, the local director composing the board and the qualifications of teachers being a knowledge of the three R's.

He was married in 1822 to Lucy Story by whom he had several children, viz. Edward, David, Adoniram, Arthur, Samantha, Lucy, and Ziba.

His wife died in 1844 and in 1859 he was married to Sarah Decker, she dying he was married again in 1870 to Elizabeth Dillinger

The remains were interred in Burlingham cemetery on March 20, 1883 in the presence of quite a large number of persons, about 1/2 of whom were relatives.

#### An anecdote:

Job Story walked from Ohio to New Hampshire to visit. It took him 80 days to make the trip. He then walked back to Meigs County Ohio to get his land[?]. He then walked back to New Hampshire and when he was all loaded up to move the horse kicked him and broke his leg. He went back in the house and waited one year before he came to Meigs County.

#### HISTORICAL NOTES:

Whig Party (1834-56), major political party formed to oppose Andrew Jackson and the Democratic party. Led by Henry Clay and Daniel Webster, the Whigs supported the American System, a high protective tariff, a national bank, and federal aid for roads, canals, and bridges. The Whigs were victorious in 1840 by parading William Henry Harrison as a humble "log cabin" candidate who drank hard cider, and they won again in 1848 with another war hero, Gen. Zachary Taylor. The slavery issue and the annexation of Texas destroyed the Whigs, and in 1856 many members joined either the Know-Nothing party or the new Republican party, which opposed the extension of slavery. [GAHFF]

Free-Soil Party (1848-54), a political party organized to oppose the spread of slavery into the territories acquired from Mexico. The party consisted of former Liberty party members and antislavery Democrats and Whigs. In the election of 1848 they chose Martin Van Buren as their presidential candidate and Charles Francis Adams as vice president. They drew enough votes from the Democratic candidate, Lewis Cass, to make possible the election of the Whig candidate, Zachary Taylor. The party's slogan was, "Free soil, free speech, free labor, and free men." In 1854 the party dissolved, and many of its members joined the new Republican party.

The Republican party was organized in 1854 to oppose the extension of slavery. John C. Frémont was the party's first but unsuccessful presidential candidate in 1856, and in 1860 Abraham Lincoln became the first Republican candidate elected to the presidency. [GAHFF]

Strictly honest in all of his dealings he acquired to good will, confidence, and esteem of all with whom he associated, and his children proved to the world that they were properly instructed in youth by living useful, quite, and orderly lives.

The remains were interred in Burlingham cemetery on March 20, 1883 in the presence of quite a large number of persons, about 1/2 of whom were relatives.

#### An anecdote:

Job Story walked from Ohio to New Hampshire to visit. It took him 80 days to make the trip. He then walked back to Meigs County Ohio to get his land[?]. He then walked back to New Hampshire and when he was all loaded up to move the horse kicked him and broke his leg. He went back in the house and waited one year before he came to Meigs County.

"Boys, I'm going to take you on the wildest, longest, roughest, maybe riskiest trail of any you have ever seen. But I judge you are men, which is why I picked you. I'm the boss of this drive. If anyone doesn't like that, or doesn't want to go along, he can step down now, and no questions asked, and no hard feelings."

This is what 24 men heard before joining up in 1866 with 28 year old Nelson Story to make the now famous cattle drive from Texas to Montana, according to Paul Wellman in "The Greatest Cattle Drive." With their help, Story was able to bring the herd up to Bozeman with only two Indian fights and the loss of only three men.

[Nelson] Story was born April 4, 1838 in Meigs [County] Ohio. His father died when he was seventeen and his mother died three years later. On March 15, 1858, at the age of 20, Nelson Story cut short his collegiate education and left Ohio with a vague notion of were he was headed.

According to the "History of Montana, Vol. II.," he said he was "simply going West to better by condition."

Major John B. Catlin, who accompanied Story on the drive, is quoted in "History of Montana, Vol. II," "I want to say now, after three years on the skirmish line in the Civil War, that I have never seen a fighting man like Nelson Story. He hunted a fight, and when he found it, he knew how to handle it. He never carried a rifle, but there were always two big navy revolvers on his hip. He was always splendidly mounted and would ride like the wind. He would say 'Come on. boys,' and ride away. Of course we followed him - we would have followed him to hell - but, accustomed as the Civil War made me to following a daredevil leader, there were a good many times when Nelson Story had me guessing. The Indians soon got to know him. Also, they feared him. They knew he would go through with whatever he undertook and they had no time to bother with him."

Malcolm Story remembered his grandfather as tough, too. "When a man tried to jump his claim back in 1865, my grandfather shot his hand off!" Nelson Story had worked out his claim by the fall of 1865, and took off for New York City with his fortune in gold dust. He exchanged his gold for about \$30,000 in greenbacks, a considerable rate of return for the day, and headed down to Texas to purchase cattle. The resulting cattle drive up to Montana assured Nelson Story's mark in Montana history.

"Back in 1872, my grandfather went to the San Fernando Valley to buy 1,000 Mexican mustang mares to bring back up to Montana," said Story. "On his way back, the Mormons wouldn't let him cross their land until he paid 'taxes' on his herd. Story was a tough man, but he knew when he was licked. He paid with half his herd, and came on through.

"Ransom it was, but it only took a couple of years to get the herd back up to the original thousand.

"But, that's how he happened to know the Los Angeles area.

"Now, after the bad winter of 1886-87, a lot of cattle owners in Montana were wiped out. My grandfather, though, held on to his herd of 16,000 head of cattle. You see, he had leases on the Crow Reservation, and had sufficient feed to sustain his entire herd.

"When he sold out in 1892, he took the proceeds and invested in downtown Los Angeles real estate. The Story Building was build on 6th and Broadway and is still known has the Story Building today."

According to the "History of Montana, Vol. II," Story's cattle sale resulted in one of the largest single transactions of the sale

Story concluded, "After that terrible winter, cattlemen had to put up their cattle to avoid another disaster to avoid another disaster like to one in 1886."

One interesting fact about Nelson Story that some people may not know...In 1864, when Sheriff Henry Plummer's "road agents" were terrorizing the countryside with highway robberies and random killings, four of his gang, who had been apprehended by the law, were to be hanged at a public hanging. When members of Plummer's gang showed up at the square and threatened to disrupt the proceedings, Nelson Story stood up against the outlaws. They backed off and the hanging took place.

Afterwards, Story was asked to join the Vigilantes of Virginia City, local citizens who had joined forces to fight the Plummer gang. Story's name is listed on the roster along with the other Vigilantes of Virginia City. The Vigilantes were as organized and tough as the men they were rounding up, and by September of 1865, members of the Plummer gang were either dead or had fled the area.

From "Meigs' 'Storied' Story Family:"

"Older residents of Athens County and Meigs County recall seeing a famed photograph of the home of Nelson Story in Bozeman, Montana, and their childhood impression was that it was "as big as the Athens County Courthouse." It was then the finest private home between St. Paul and Seattle, and Nelson Story was the richest man in all Montana. Family [...] that Walter Story, a son of Byron story, years ago went to Montana under the sponsorship of his rich uncle. "Nelson Story had gone west before the home shown above [in source article] was built. Then he was a boy of eighteen who had taught school and attended Ohio University after being orphaned at the age of 14. Ten years later he was a rich man and had done what the United States Army said could not be done - fought off 3000 Indians with 26 men armed with breach-loading rifles of the day. None of his forebears ever went so far or found such high adventure as Nelson Story. He never dodged a fight or a fortune. He was caught by the growing romance of the West a boy, walked to the Ohio River at Pomeroy, took a boat to St. Louis, another boat to Fort Leavenworth up the Missouri, in Kansas, and with \$18 in his pocket started to carve out a career.

"When 18 year old Nelson Story arrived in the West in 1856 there were buffalo, cowboys and bad men, and soldiers in forts. He at once became a driver of freight wagons, but within a year owned his own wagons and never drew another wage in his life. He took his wagons into Montana when gold was struck there in 1863, but stuck to his freight and store business, helped to hang a famous stage robbers, and became a captain of the Vigilantes. At 28 he was a rich man and soon became richer by acquiring a gold mine. Then he went to Texas to buy cattle for the ranches of Montana where beef was scarce. Before taking off on his 1500-mile trip over the prairies and mountains[,] he had married in 1865.

"Great herds of cheap Texas cattle were being driven north and Nelson Story bought 3000\* head. Kansas Jayhawkers demanded a heavy toll for driving cattle through their territory. Nelson Story refused to pay this toll and headed north for Bozeman Trail Montana, where is cattle could be sold for \$40 a head.

"At Fort Leavenworth he gathered a group of fighting men, armed them with Remington single shot rifles and started his herd through a wild country infested with Indians, a trip 1500 miles long, over prairies and through the mountain passes. Freight wagons were added to the outfit. Soldiers warned them against the dangerous trip. Many white men had been killed in the area by the Indians and the Story train was attacked once by 3000 red men, who were beaten off by the rapid fire of 27 men, including Nelson. Late in 1866 his herd was safe in Montana and one of the most remarkable journeys in the history of the West had been completed. A herd of 3000 cattle had been driven from Texas to the valleys of western Montana.

"Nelson Story became the largest raiser of horses and cattle on Montana, owned many buildings in Bozeman, started a bank and became its president, built a flour mill and a fine home. He gave the 60 -acre campus for Montana College, once sold 13,000 cattle in a single transaction spent his winters in Los Angeles, built that city's first skyscraper and died at the age of 88 in 1926."

\*Note by his grandson, Malcolm Story, states "in 1866 my grandfather - Nelson Sr. brought 1000 cows - not 3000 - to Montana. Sold out cir. 1887-8 13,000 head."

In 1882 [1892?] he was proprietor of the Elmwood House, Laconia.

He was a performer on different instruments, and was widely known as a martial and orchestral musician.

Mr. Story [is] a Democrat, active in politics and a frequent incumbent of civil offices, holding many minor offices in different towns, besides being deputy sheriff of Merrimac county, 1871-73, deputy sheriff of Belknap county from 1874 to 1877, selectman of Laconia in 1881-2, and sheriff of Belknap county from 1883 to 1886.






